Supervisor Kusnierz confirmed with the Principal Account Clerk that almost all vouchers had been signed and noted that there were 3 items for discussion. The voucher was received in April 2022, after the 2021 books were closed, and the funds were reallocated to the General Fund's Fund Balance, so this will require a budget amendment.

The second item involved a Planning Board meeting that was canceled due to lack of a quorum. Vouchers were received from 3 Planning Board Members for that meeting. Supervisor Kusnierz recommended, that as no public business had occurred, the vouchers not be paid. Councilmember Noonan stated that he would support not paying the vouchers if the meeting didn't happen. Councilmember Stewart felt that the \$50 or \$60 isn't specifically for the time spent at the meeting itself, but for the work put in ahead of the meeting and thinks the voucher should be paid. Councilmembers Donohue and VanTassel agree with Councilmember Stewart, that those members took the time to come to the meeting and that the effort comes from being prepared.

The third item was the Orbital Fire LLC voucher which exceeded the previously agreed-upon rate. The proposed and authorized amount was \$200/mo for Cybersecurity. The cost beginning in April is \$220.60/mo, which means that the annual cost will now be more than \$2,000/year, requiring a resolution.
