# 15 MINUTE PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

Vince Sporrer asked if there was going to be a Hazardous Waste Day again this year.

# DAVID MEAGER - ADIRONDACK TRUST INSURANCE PRESENTATION

David Meager was present from Adirondack Trust Insurance to present the new insurance policy for the Town of Moreau for the period of 5/1/14 through 5/1/15.

David Meager presented a summary of the policy and went through it with the Town Board explaining what the different components of the policy covered.

He said there was an overall 2% increase in the premium, but that is still \$6,000.00 less than the prior company wanted to charge before the Town switched to NYMIR.

The Board Members asked a few questions and David Meager answered them.

# **DELORES RICE FROM FENIMORE**

Delores Rice was present along with Allan Rice, Minnie Rosati, Nancy Rosati and Dorothy Lacko, who reside in Fenimore.

Delores Rice spoke about a house fire at 194 Ferry Blvd. that occurred about a month ago and how the road was blocked and she was not able to get to her house when she came home from work. She wasn't even able to walk in. She stated this is a safety hazard. She also stated that this has occurred before in the past and been brought to the Town Board's attention in the past. She stated that when Sisson Road was discontinued at the end by the cement quarry and the land turned over to the Cement Company the Cement Company was supposed to build another access road into Fenimore and that never happened. It is her understanding that an agreement was reached between the Town and the Cement Company whereby the Cement Company wouldn't have to build the access road if the Town was allowed to attach their sewer line to the bridge that the Cement Company owns and that spans the cement quarry into Glens Falls. She asked how emergency vehicles are supposed to get into Fenimore if the road is closed during a

fire and how are people in Fenimore supposed to get out in an emergency if there is only one road in and out. She stated that an access road should be considered. She said that Supervisor Jenkins talked to her about this and he mentioned the possibility of a road being put in for emergency purposes only. However, she doesn't want this road to become a party place.

Supervisor Jenkins recalled that when the Glens Falls Cement Company renewed their mining permit through NYS DEC the last time, the operator of the salvage yard that is on the site of his family's former junkyard talked about putting in a road, but it never happened. The Cement Company at the time said they wouldn't be opposed to an easement to allow the Town to put in an access road and he thought there was talk about the Cement Company being willing to supply the base material for a road. However, it never went any farther than that. He wouldn't be against exploring this option.

Nancy Rosati stated that about two years ago she had to call the ambulance for her husband and it took them 40 minutes to get to her house on Grant Road in Fenimore. She said that a number of years ago there was talk about making Anderson Road a secondary access into Fenimore.

Councilman Prendergast thought the former Highway Superintendent supplied the Town Board with a cost estimate to put an access road in. He said he was willing to look into this.

Delores Rice thanked the Town Board for their time.

# THE CHAZEN COMPANIES - FARMLAND PROTECTION PLAN UPDATE

#### 15 MINUTE PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

Gardner Congdon said he was told there is a new regulation through the Building Department whereby an engineer has to determine that the ground water level is five feet below the cellar floor. Is this true? How did it come about? What was the thought process behind the regulation?

Supervisor Jenkins said it is true. He said it came about because of Phase 1 of the Michael's Group Subdivision and it was put into effect in Phase 2 of the Michael's Group Subdivision and they had to do exactly that.

Gardner Congdon said what he is hearing then is that the Michael's Group "fouled up their development, screwed up his development and as the result of that you are telling the people of this Town who want to build their own house that they have to spend an extra \$5,000.00 if there is water five feet below their cellar floor."

Supervisor Jenkins said no, he isn't saying that. He said it wasn't because of the Michael's Group it was because of the 40 phone calls we got and the letters we got.

Gardner Congdon said the Michael's Group falsified their plan, it was brought up in a meeting and they admitted it and Joe Patricke said he wasn't there when the test hole was dug and this Town Board never did a thing about it. He said Councilman Prendergast was on the Town Board at the time and he didn't do anything about it and he said none of the Town Board Members did anything about it, but they are willing to put this cost on the kids in this Town who are trying to build a house, because the Michael's Group "fouled up". He said the Town hired engineers and they were never able to determine that water flows downhill. He said a drain was put in and the water table is down and that isn't good enough. Now you have to go another five feet and put a sump pump in and pump water out to a drywell and into the yard so the water can go back through the sand and back into the cellar.

Councilman Kusnierz asked if it is a new regulation and Supervisor Jenkins said it goes back to 2008.

Gardner Congdon said that Councilman Kusnierz was on the Town Board too at the time and said that none of them acknowledged that water flows downhill. He said isn't it strange that when they put the drain in the water table went back down.

Gardner Congdon said he has been five years trying to get the drainage ditch out on Route 32 corrected. He said if the Town Board Members drive out of the municipal complex and turn left onto Route 197 and then left onto Route 32 and look at the ditch immediately to their left they will see that it is dry, but the ditch on the other side of where the telephone company has their utilities is full of water. He said "they have to ask themselves what that does when there is major drainage that runs from the back of those houses to Route 32 and it has been held up for five years". He said he talked to Tim Burley and Mike Shaver when it was done and he talked to Supervisor Jenkins and all he heard was that if the water table is five feet below your cellar floor you have to put in a \$5,000.00 system, but the Town Board can't even make sure their infrastructure is properly done. He asked if he was going to get an answer. Is the pipe going to be lowered or does he have to sue the Town? What does he have to do to get it done? He said it is "holding the water table higher in that whole area". He asked if doesn't the Town Board understand that water flows downhill and if there is an obstruction it holds it back?

Councilman Kusnierz said he understands it and Gardner Congdon asked him why it hasn't been corrected then and Councilman Kusnierz said, because he isn't an expert in hydrology. Gardner Congdon said he just told them water runs downhill and Councilman Kusnierz asked if he wanted him to answer or not. Gardner Congdon told Councilman Kusnierz that he sits on the Town Board and the Town Board hired an expert in hydrology and he doesn't understand drainage. Councilman Kusnierz said he understands drainage, he put in 10,000 feet of drainage. Gardner Congdon said this is simple drainage out there and it is holding the water table artificially high for 100 houses and then this kind of regulation goes into effect. He asked what kind of Town we have here. He said it is crazy.

Gardner Congdon also stated that the Town Board should install a sound system if they want the public to participate, because they are sitting here straining to hear what is said and by the time they get a chance to talk they are so mad, because they aren't able to hear anything that they sound off like he does.

Terry Clark approached the Town Board and said that his water line burst in his house from the "great contractor that installed the water system".

Supervisor Jenkins said he didn't think they could discuss this, because of it involves litigation.

Terry Clark said he had pictures and asked the Town Board to look at them. He explained how the plumbing was done. He said he had 7 inches of water in his basement (5,500 gallons he said). His insurance company shouldn't have to pay for this. Either the Town or the contractor should pay for this. He also doesn't have grass yet on his property. He didn't want the contractor to dig up his driveway so the contractor bored under his driveway. The airline he used had duct tape on it. He asked where the warranty is. He has been told that the Town's responsibility is to the curb stop and he was also told it was to the meter.

Supervisor Jenkins said he thinks it is to the meter. He told Terry Clark that "they" will see what happens and "they" won't walk away from this.

Rich Morris thanked the Highway Department for the great job they did helping to stave off the flooding of the homes on the Old Bend Road.

Rich Morris recommended that the Town Board conduct a survey of the properties along Route 9 that would be impacted by the Sewer District Extension that is proposed. It would help to determine a basis for the future and we will know what we can afford to pay for.

Gardner Congdon went back to the regulation about the 5 feet below the cellar floor and discussion ensued between him and Supervisor Jenkins.

Gardner Congdon said he wants to know how they can justify this regulation.

Gardner Congdon spoke about a fence and shed that was encroaching on his property and how nobody caught it when permits were issued.

Councilman Prendergast asked Gardner Congdon if he asked Joe Patricke for an explanation and Gardner Congdon replied; "no I would just get gobbly gook". Gardner Congdon then said that Joe Patricke's solution to the problem was for him to go back before the Planning Board for a line adjustment and a new mylar would be drawn up. He asked why the permit was issued in the first place.

Supervisor Jenkins said "they" would find out the answers.

Councilman Kusnierz publicly thanked Robert Sheehan for his service as a Trustee on the Crandall Library Board. Mr. Sheehan resigned, because he has moved out of state.

Councilwoman LeClair asked if the Board Members had any objection to the Town Historian's Yearly Report being posted on the website. She also asked if they minded if tributes were placed on the website honoring people like Tom Tracy and Ted Monsour for their civic duties. No objections were voiced.

Supervisor Jenkins reported that he was meeting with Congressman Owens to discuss the potential of a Canadian Company investing in Moreau.

Councilman Prendergast said he would like to get prices to have the wall in front of them on the bench lowered a little and everyone thought it was a good idea.
